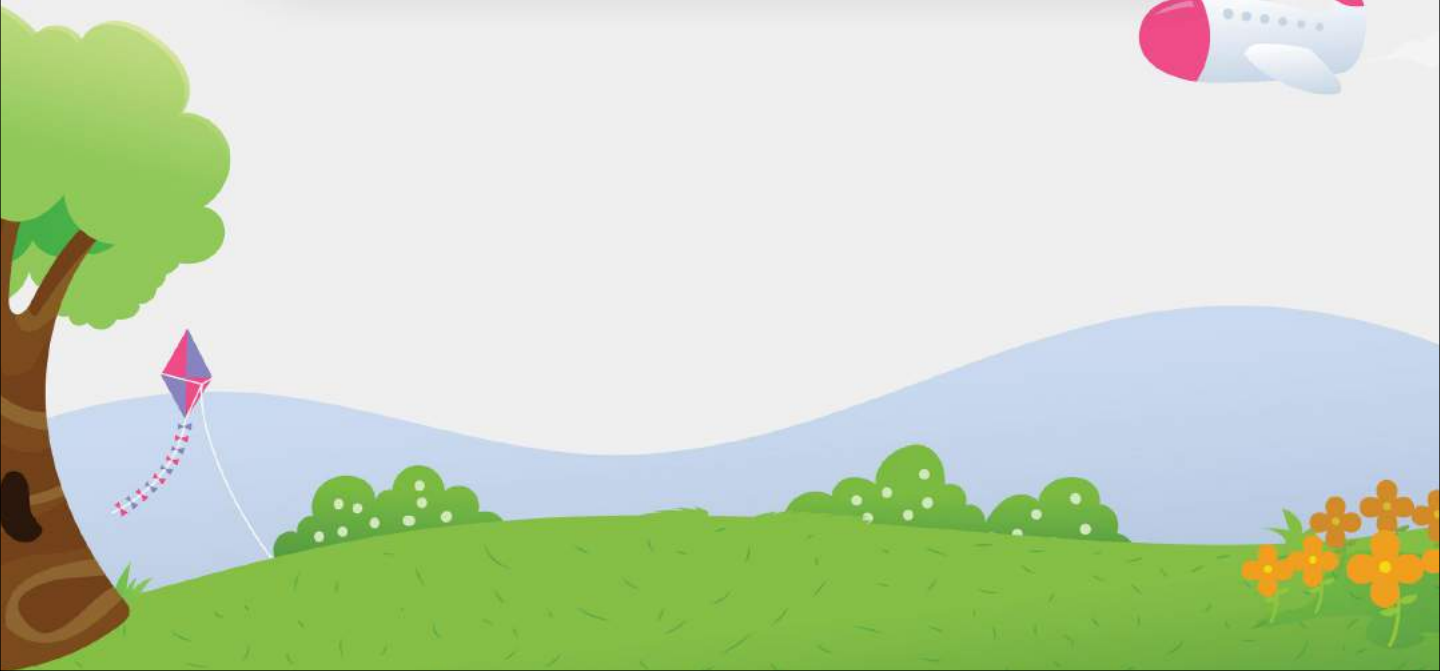

We look up to them for a bright future just as the plant look up to the Sun for Nutrition – They are indeed our Future and we will never trade the for anything.



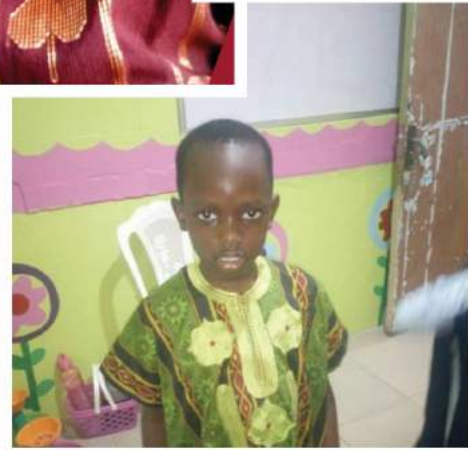

Psychologist Abraham Maslow named people he considered to have reached self-

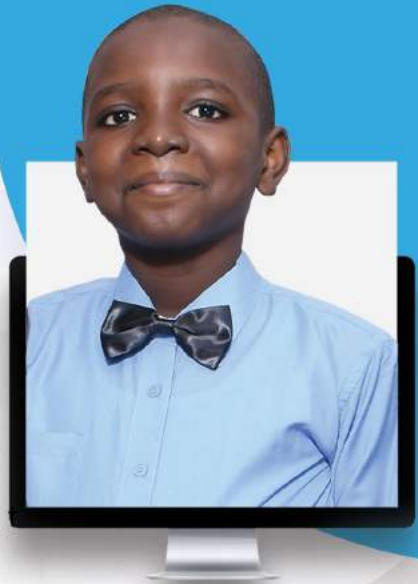
realization status; such as Albert Einstein, Abraham Lincoln, and Eleanor Roosevelt to name a few.

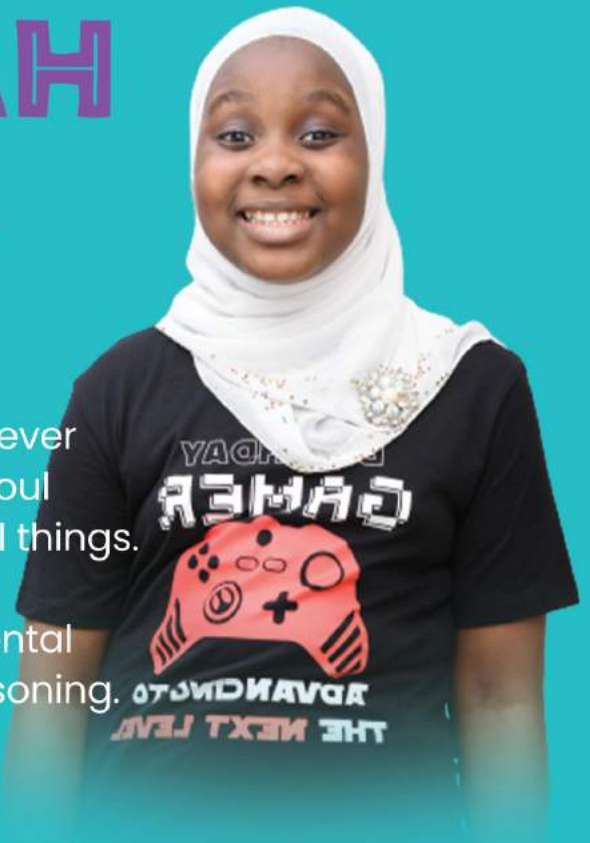
